



The Potawatomi Indian Nation, Inc. proudly presents our host drum for this festival: THE STAR SINGERS, with Lead Singer; John Bush.






MEN DANCERS

The head male dancer at the festival today is: Jerry Pigeon.








WOMEN DANCERS

Our head female dancer today is: Julie Whitepigeon.












BLACK ASH BASKETRY



Black Ash Tree.












CRAFTS








VETERAN DANCER






