Senior Project "FRESH" Program is NOW Available

The Project FRESH Program is available at your "tribal site". This program is a "pilot" program through USDA. The purposes

- of the Seniors Project FRESH Program are:
- to PROVIDE fresh, nutritious, unprepared, locally grown fruits, vegetables, and herbs from farmers markets, roadside stands, and community supported agriculture programs to qualifying seniors;
- to INCREASE the CONSUMPTION of agriculture commodities by helping with the EXPANSION of domestic farmers markets, roadside stands, and community supported agriculture programs; and
- to DEVELOP new and additional farmers markets, roadside stands, and community supported agriculture programs

The Project FRESH Program is open to Tribal Seniors, Age 55+, who are income eligible (see income guidelines below). The program PROVIDES \$100.- in COUPONS to PURCHASE "fresh fruits and vegetables"
