





BEST SCREENING TOOL ONLINE

Social Security has an online service that can provide some real help for you; it's called the Benefit Eligibility Screening Tool (BEST). By simply logging on to www.ssa.gov/best you will find out exactly what benefits you may be eligible for and the information is made available in both English and Spanish. All you need to do is answer some questions about your age and marital status and some questions about your personal finances. These questions will help determine if you may be eligible for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits, or if you can qualify for help with your Medicare premium. BEST takes only five to 10 minutes to complete and the great thing about it is you do not have to provide any personal identifying information, such as your name or Social Security number. Plus, once you exit this screening tool, all your answers will be permanently erased.

SSA AND THE NEW YORK FIRE DEPARTMENT

The New York City Fire Department (FDNY) is helping the Social Security Administration (SSA) deliver the message that Direct Deposit is a safe, convenient and easy way to receive Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments. With direct deposit, payments are deposited automatically into accounts and are readily available for immediate use. Direct deposit presents an advantage for the government as well. It costs the government 45 cents to process and mail a check while it costs only 4 cents to send a payment by direct deposit. Last year, direct deposit saved the Social Security Trust Funds approximately \$133 million.

Signing up for direct deposit is relatively simple and easy, just call SSA's toll free number, 1-800-772-1213 (or 1-800-325-0778 for TTY users), or visit the nearest local Social Security office. Banks, savings and loan or credit unions can also help people sign up for direct deposit.

ELDER OF THE MONTH Frank Edward Person





Frank was born August 15, 1920 in Dowagiac, Michigan. He is the son of Frank Montell and Jennie Selner. His grandparents were Joseph and Susan Battise. His Great Great Grandparents were Levi Calvier and Elisabeth Aeachi. The Person family of six moved from Dowagiac to Mishawaka when Frank was 6 years old. Frank is the sole survivor.

He graduated from Mishawaka High School in 1940 and enlisted in the U.S. Army on January 8th, 1942. He was honorably discharged on October 31, 1945 when he held the rank of Sergeant. While in the service, he spent forty months of combat duty in the Southwest Pacific. Campaigns were East Indies; Papuan, New Guinea; South Philippines; and Luzon, Manila. He has received the following Decorations and citations: Asiatic Pacific Ribbon with five battle stars, Philippine Libertarian Ribbon with one battle star, Distinguished Unit Citation with Oak Leaf Cluster, Good Conduct Medal, and Six Overseas Service Bars. Returning home he was hospitalized three months.

Frank married his childhood sweetheart. Colleen Hofmann, who has been his wife for 56 years. They have two children, a son, Gary, a Vietnam Veteran, and a daughter, Carol Ann Hope. He has two grandsons and two granddaughters, all of which are tribal members.

Frank and Colleen are members of Grace Bible Chapel. He has been retired from Uniroyal in Mishawaka after 39 ½ years. Frank is a canoe buff and has many wilderness trips. "All part of our heritage," he says. He taught canoeing while he was a scoutmaster for the Boys Scouts. He also participated in canoe racing. He never came in first but always came in second by three seconds.

His only regret is not finding his Potawatomi family sooner. "My heart and door is always open to them."

WOULD YOU LIKE TO TAKE AN ACTIVE ROLE IN HELPING POKAGON BAND CHILDREN AND THEIR FAMILIES?

Tribal Council has established by ordinance a Child Welfare Commission to aid the Social Service Department and the Tribal Court with child protection matters. Some of the important responsibilities of the Child Welfare Commission are:

Monitor child welfare proceedings involving tribal members in State or Tribal courts, and make recommendations to the Tribal Court regarding the need to take formal Court action to protect a child pursuant to appropriate laws of the Band;

Make case management recommendations to the Band's Social Services workers and officials regarding the care, custody and supervision of tribal children under Court jurisdiction; and

Conduct informal conferences with a child and the child's parent(s), guardian, or custodian, as provided in the Band's child welfare laws, to discuss alternatives to formal court jurisdiction for resolving concerns about the proper care and supervision of a child or to refer appropriate cases to any traditional or alternative dispute resolution body created by the Band.

Tribal Council is currently looking to appoint five (5) members to the Commission. To be appointed as a Commissioner, you must:

Be a legally competent Pokagon Band member at least eighteen (18) years of age at the time of appointment;

Must sign and abide by a statement acknowledging the standards of confidentiality required for serving as a Commissioner; and

Must submit to and pass a background security check investigating whether your past conduct would interfere with your duties as a Commissioner or would create an immediate or long-term risk for any child.

A Commissioner may not be:


A Tribal Council member; nor

An employee of any Pokagon Band Department or program delivering or with the potential to deliver services under a child welfare case plan, nor any spouse of such employee, nor an employee of a State agency providing child welfare services.





"The Pokagon's Tell It"

Writer's Guidelines for Your Views (editorials)

What to do:

After you write a letter, make sure your full name and mailing address is on it. "Your Views" does not publish anonymous or "name withheld" letters. We also don't publish letters that carry only a set of initials for the author. Your address is needed for verification, but it will not be published. Nor will we disclose your address to anyone who might ask for it.

Where to send letters:

Verification: All letters must carry the author's full name and mailing address, in addition to your e-mail address if available. We acknowledge every letter with a postcard mailed the same day your letter arrives. Letters without a return address are automatically excluded.

Identification: Authors willing to have their full name published are given preference over writers who ask that only their first initial and last name used.

Sloppiness: E-mail is convenient and quick, but unfortunately many e-mail writers ignore basic rules of writing when sending a letter. Please use the same care you would if the letter were being prepared for standard mail. Follow common punctuation, grammar and spelling rules. Writers who ignore these rules decrese their chances of being published.

Originality: Letters written to a third party, such as the governor or a congressman, and copied to Pokegnek Yajdanawa are not original. We prefer not to publish these "open" letters to officials.

What we look for:

Brevity: Cover the topic in the fewest possible words

Focus: Your letter should make a point, and you should get to that point quickly.

Style: Avoid adjectives such as "really " or "extremely". Avoid phrases such as "in my opinion" or " as I see it". Readers know that opinions are being presented; these phrases are unnecessary.

Fairness: Avoid personal attacks and disparagement of a group of people based on the actions of a member of that group. Argue your points on the merits, not on emotions.

Edit Yourself: After writing the letter, read it aloud. Put yourself in the place of the reader. Is your point clear? Is there a faster, better way to say what you're trying to say?

Readability: Readers are attracted to short sentences. Keep to one idea per sentence. Avoid using more than three numbers in a sentence.

Why do we edit letters?

All letters to Your Views are accepted with the condition that we reserve the right to edit. We make every attempt to preserve the writer's essential meaning. Editing is done throughout the newspaper, whether the writer is a paid professional or letter writer. The main reason for editing is that it allows us to accept more letters to the editor. An editor's job is to determine which part of piece of writing is most essential to make a point. We also correct errors of grammar and spelling and delete inflammatory material. The most likely candidate for extensive editing is a letter that is twice the length it needs to be to make a point, or one that tries to make too many points.

How can I tell if you're going to publish my letter so I can send it to someone else?

Please have your letter in by the 13th of the month to assure it will be in the following month's newsletter. Call 1-800-517-0777 or e-mail: gwesaw@pokagon.com. If it's not published within that range, chances are it was not accepted for one of several reasons. Unfortunately, we cannot respond to every letter we don't accept with a reason for its rejection.




