

Summer Camp is Coming!


What does popcom, drumming, swimming and black ash baskets have in common? Well, they are all part of plans for the Pokagon Band







To All Members Of The Pokagon Band:

The Tribal Council proposes to make two changes in the Pokagon Band Of Potawatomi Indians By-Laws in connection with management of the Band's finances. In accordance with the procedures for By-Law Amendments approved by Tribal Council Resolution 00-09-09-02, Band Members are hereby notified of the following proposed changes.

- 1. To establish a Finance Board as a Standing Committee, Article VI, Section 1 of the By-Laws is proposed to be amended by adding the following new language at the end of that section:
- (d) <u>FINANCE BOARD</u>: The purpose of the Finance Board is to assist Council in budgeting and financial management. The purposes, powers and duties of the Finance Board are more fully set out in the Finance Board Ordinance.
- To revise and update the duties of the office of Treasurer of the Pokagon Band per Tribal Council Resolutions 00-05-13-01 and 00-05-13-02, Article V, Section 5 of the By-Laws is proposed to be amended to read as follows:

Section 5: Treasurer
